



At our General Meeting in June, I suggested that we start a little earlier with the Coats for Kids program. I suppose, because I showed an interest, GK Garry Shepp asked me to Chair the program.

At our September Council meeting this Community Program was approved and we went ahead to buy and distribute the coats. While we're still in the planning stage for the distribution of the coats I suggested that St Vincent de Paul Society was better suited to identify a group in need and distribute the coats;this is what we did.

With the help of Brother Mike Finch, I contacted State to get the ball rolling and fortunately, because we started early, we were able to buy two boxes [24 coats] for the price of one (\$345.00).

I contacted Donelda Lapointe of SSVP to discuss where it would be best for the coats to go. Having had previous experience with Bayview Elementary School I suggested that school, it being in a less affluent part of Nanaimo. Donelda was good with that suggestion. I contacted the school principal and she was THRILLED.

The coats arrived at Holy Trinity Catholic in late October and SSVP delivered the coats to Bayview Elementary on Halloween Day when the school was having a Dressup Day, and all the staff were dressed as bumble bees. Students and staff were having a great time. The school principal was happy to select the kids in need. Pictures were taken and I believe the kids faces tell a story that words won't tell.

Thanks to Bros. Mike Finch, Garry Shepp, Council 9990, and St Vincent de Paul Society for their help in making this worthwhile project happen.

This is a Feel-Good project all around.





DID YOU KNOW?

St. Kateri Tekakwitha

St. Kateri Tekakwitha, Tekakwitha also spelled Tegakwitha or Tegakouita, baptized Catherine Tekakwitha, byname Lily of the Mohawks, (born 1656, probably Ossernenon, now Auriesville, N.Y, and died April 17, 1680, Caughnawaga, Quebec; canonized October 21, 2012; feast day in the U.S., July 14; and in Canada, April 17), the first American Indian canonized as a saint in the Catholic Church.

Tekakwitha was the child of a Mohawk father and a Christianized Algonquin mother. At age four she was the only member of her family to survive smallpox, which affected her own health. She was deeply impressed at age 11 by the lives and words of three visiting Jesuits, likely the first white Christians she had ever seen. She lead a life inspired by the example of those men, and at age 20 she was instructed in religion and baptized Catherine (rendered Kateri in Mohawk speech) by Jacques de Lamberville, a Jesuit missionary.

Harassed, stoned, and threatened with torture in her home village, she fled 200 miles to the Christian Indian mission of St. Francis Xavier at Sault Saint-Louis, near Montreal. There she was known as the "Lily of the Mohawks" in recognition of her kindness, prayer, faith, and heroic suffering. Accounts of Tekakwitha's life as written by the missionaries contributed significantly to the documentation for her beatification, which began in 1932 and proclaimed by Pope John Paul II in 1980. In December 2011, after evaluating the testimony of a young boy who claimed that his infection with flesh-eating bacteria disappeared after he prayed for her intercession, Pope Benedict XVI recognized Tekakwitha as a saint.

Our Faith Community

The look of our Church continues to evolve:

Our Blessed Virgin Mary has finally been assigned a permanent place in the Sanctuary. Our master craftsman and immediate Past Grand Knight, Norbert, has very carefully extracted her from the wheeled platform and created a new, classical pedestal for her. Norbert also added some shelving to the base of the Tabernacle where our sacramental oils will be housed in three beautiful crystal vials. Plans are afoot to move the red Tabernacle light from the Chapel and install it in the Sanctuary.

Also, it was Norbert's exacting eye, aided by his sophisticated electronic equipment, that arrived at the perfect placement of the Stations of the Cross that previously resided in the Chapel.

We moved the image of "Jesus, I trust in You" because it was deemed advisable to put some physical distance between the images of infant and risen Christ. Our meeting and work areas may feel more Catholic now that we have finally hung ten Crucifixes throughout the Upper Level.

Attendance at our Masses has been increasing. Accordingly, we have slightly rearranged the seating in the Nave and added 20 more seats. There is still room for 30 more regulated spaces. Also, we have filled the Overflow / Lounge to the maximum regulated capacity of 81 seats.

It was recommended that meetings are no longer held in the Lounge. It is too much work to move all the chairs around and get them back in the correct places.

The addition of the pickle ball court has been a great success.

Over the past while you may have noticed even more improvements around our Church and Rectory undertaken by your four brothers on the Maintenance Committee .
