DID YOU KNOW?


<u>"St. Joseph, Principal Patron of Canada"</u>

Everything we know about the husband of Mary and the foster father of Jesus comes from Scripture. Joseph came from a royal lineage. Luke and Matthew disagree some about the details of Joseph's genealogy but they both mark his descent from David. Indeed the angel who first tells Joseph about Jesus greets him as "son of David," a royal title used also for Jesus.



We know Joseph was a compassionate, caring man. When he discovered Mary was pregnant after they had been betrothed, he knew the child was not his but was unaware that she was carrying the Son of God. However, when an angel came to Joseph in a dream and told him "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit", he did as the angel told him and took Mary as his wife. When the angel came again to tell him that his family was in danger, he immediately left everything he owned, and fled to a strange country with his young wife and the baby. He waited in Egypt without question until the angel told him it was safe to go back. There is much we still wish we could know about Joseph -- exactly where and when he was born, how he spent his days, exactly when and how he died. But Scripture has left us with the most important knowledge: who he was -- "a righteous man". His feast day is March 19.

Seder Dinner March 28:

You and your immediate family (spouse and children) are invited to celebrate a Seder Meal with your brothers and sisters in Christ on Holy Thursday, March 28, in the Parish Hall-to be concluded before the 7 p.m. Mass. What is the Seder Meal? you might ask. As you know, Jesus' Passion occurred during the Jewish week-long festival of Passover-the commemoration of the Israelites' Exodus from Egypt and their transition from slavery to freedom. The main ritual of Passover is the seder-a festive meal that involves re-telling the Exodus through stories and the consumption of ritual foods, including matzah (unleavened bread) and maror (bitter herbs). Saint Mark tells us that on the first day of Unleavened Bread, Jesus ate the Passover (the Last Supper) with his twelve disciples. We will be following a Christian version of the Jewish Passover Seder. There is a seven-page ceremony that will precede the consumption of the meal. While there are three speaking roles in the ceremony, all participants follow along and have group responses throughout. There will be a small fee to cover incidentals, including lamb.
