Members of HTCWL recently created this poster showcasing some of the many gifts or charisms we have to share in the wonderful things we do. Let us be grateful for each other.




Update on Stone Soup

From the President's Desk




Dear Members:



Palm Sunday

As related by Egeria, a nun from western Europe on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land in the late 4th Century, we follow her witness of early Christians waving their palm branches to commemorate the triumphal arrival of Jesus into Jerusalem.

Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.

We carry palm branches that are blessed by our priest to express our delight at Jesus' long-awaited entry into the city. It also carries with it the knowledge of what our Lord awaits in the coming days. Our joy is tinged with disquiet.

Holy Thursday

As we commemorate the last Supper in the upper room, we enter into a new covenant as Jesus washes the feet of disciples.

I have given you a model to follow, so that as I have done for you, you should also do.

At the breaking of the bread and the pouring of the wine, Jesus gives us the gift of His Body and Blood in the Eucharist. He will forever be in us and we in Him.

A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; just as I have loved you.

Good Friday

We remember the death of our Saviour. We sorrowfully trace his path as we contemplate the Stations of the Cross. We live within the space of our own pilgrimages as we stand and kneel before the shrouded cross.

O Lord by your holy Cross you have redeemed the world.

On this holy day we stand in silence, witnessing the suffering of our Lord at the hands of those who had lost their way. Our own sins come to mind knowing that in His suffering and through His agony Jesus forgives.

Father forgive them, they know not what they do.





Easter Vigil

We wait. With the Service of Light, we watch as the darkness fades in the brilliant light of the Paschal Fire. We light our own small candles to hold up and witness the lighting of the Paschal Candle.

Awake O sleeper and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give you light.

We travel back in time with prophetic readings and history from the Hebrew Testament, with psalms praising God and with Gospel messages proclaiming the coming joy. We wait for Jesus.

There is surely a future hope for you and your hope will not be cut off. Proverbs 23:18

Easter Sunday

Skor Bit Shortbread Meltaways

Ingredients

- 1 cup unsalted butter softened
- 2 tsp vanilla
- ½ cup icing sugar
- 1 ³/₄ cup pastry flour
- ½ cup corn starch
- ³/₄ tsp baking powder
- 1/4 tsp salt




Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees
- 2. In a large bowl beat butter and vanilla together until creamy.
- 3. In a separate bowl combine the icing sugar, flour, corn starch, baking powder and salt. Then gradually stir into butter batter. Add Skor bits and mix till evenly distributed. Cover with plastic wrap and chill in the fridge for 10-15 minutes.
- 4. Line baking sheet with parchment paper. Roll level tablespoons full of dough into balls and place on the baking sheet. Bake for 12-15 minutes or until starting to just turn slightly golden. Let cool on pan for 5 minutes so they won't break apart and then transfer to a cooling rack.
