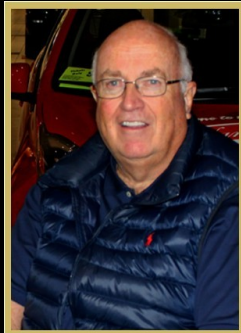

We were pleased with the very enthusiastic group of brothers who assisted in all aspect of the April 26 breakfast. This was the first breakfast where we had to work around the new mass times of 9:00 am and 11:00 am. We expected a large crowd and our purchases were in anticipation of this. We had set breakfast for 10:00 am so that we would get parishioners coming from the 9:00 am and parishioners going to the 11:00 am mass . This will be our major goal over the next several months and we can only be hope that this arrangement will be accepted by the parishioners.

Unfortunately the turnout was poor and is reflected in a gross of only \$346.22, which after covering all our expenses and replenishing the float of \$400.00 we turned over \$226.10 to the treasurer. This means that we had a deficit of \$173.90 in putting this breakfast on.

As you all know, the proceeds from our Pancake Breakfasts are a major source of funds for our projects. Key among these is our education bursaries. It is hoped that it is only a matter of time before our parishioners adjust to the new times and are able to enjoy our breakfasts.

Our next breakfast will be on May 31st. With the Canada Day BBQ on July 1st, we will not be having a Pancake Breakfast in June. After May, our next breakfast will be at the end of summer. Please consider coming out to assist with this project.

Do You Know?

SAINT JOHN THE APOSTLE

Apostle John, (B. circa 6 AD – D. circa 100 AD), Western feast day December 27; Eastern feast days May 8 and September 26.

John was born to Zebedee and Salome, a family of Jewish fishermen on the Sea of Galilee. He was the younger brother of James and according to some traditions, a cousin of Jesus, as his mother Salome was believed to be the sister of Mary. John worked as a fisherman alongside his father and brother.

John, the youngest of Jesus' twelve disciples, was known as the "Beloved Disciple" and traditionally credited with authoring several New Testament works. He was among the first disciples called by Jesus. John was part of Jesus' inner circle with Peter and James, witnessing key events such as the Transfiguration and the raising of Jairus' daughter, and he remained close to Jesus during the crucifixion. He is traditionally identified as the "Beloved Disciple" in the Gospel of John, emphasizing his intimate relationship with Christ.

John is traditionally credited with writing the Gospel of John, three epistles and the Book of Revelation. His writings emphasize love, faith, and the divinity of Christ, reflecting his close relationship with Jesus and his theological insights.

Before Jesus died on the cross, He entrusted His mother, Mary to John's care. When Mary died, John wrote his three epistles. He outlived the other apostles and was the only one to die of natural causes, though he faced persecution. According to legend John was arrested by Emperor Domitian (81-98 AD) and was plunged into boiling oil from which he miraculously escaped unscathed. It's a dramatic story but the bible never mentions it! So where did it come from? Tertullian, a 2nd century theologian is the first to mention that John was plunged into a boiling cauldron of oil. However, John was banished to the island of Patmos by Domitian where he recorded the book of Revelations. Eventually John made it back to Ephesus and died an ordinary death. He was the only apostle to die of old age; the others were martyred for their faith.

"Well, no. You see, as the squirrel was running, an eagle came down out of the sky, grabbed the squirrel in his talons, and flew away!"

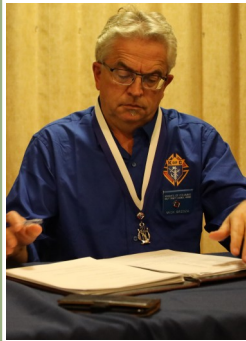
"Is that when you swore?" asked the amazed priest.

A SHORT HISTORY OF HOLY TRINITY COUNCIL #9990



Our council was formed on February 13, 1989 with 33 members. When we celebrated our 20th anniversary in Feb. 2009, we were fortunate to have all our past grand knights plus the past district deputy responsible for the formation of our council in attendance – see photo below. As the second council in Nanaimo we often join forces with the *Mid Island Council #3842* for major functions such as the installation of officers, with each council hosting on alternating years. Several past grand knight went on to be our district deputy and editor of the state newspaper.

Sad to say that only 3 of the PGKs in that picture along with the District Deputy are still with us (Jim Loftus; Ed Landry; Allan Crowe and D.D. Claude Francoeur). Over the years we have been blessed with active membership chairmen and other knights who have been instrumental in increasing our membership which has seen our council expand from 33 members to over 90. We have received many of Supreme's Star Council awards and also were the recipient of their Double Star Council award.

Our council has been an active one from the beginning. We were first a number of times for the State Charity Appeal ticket sales when we had a table in both Rutherford (now NNTC) and Woodgrove malls and were always among the top sellers. We are still ranked among the top sellers under the new on-line sales program. Trinity Catholic Church was originally part of Trinity Ecumenical Centre along with the Trinity United Church. A few years ago the United Church decided to move on and as a result the R.C. Diocese of Vancouver Island became the sole owner of the property. Our members are active within the church and centre including; Eucharistic ministers, ushers, readers, sacristans, altar servers, etc. We have been involved with many different organizations over the years within our community including our church youth group, Coats for Kids, Pro-Life (including the annual March for Life walk in Victoria), St. Vincent de Paul and scholarships for graduating secondary students to mention a few. In short, we put our money and time to good use for the benefit of our church and community. We also hold pancake breakfasts which we have done from the start. Each year we put on a Christmas dinner where the proceeds go to a local charity such as St. Vincent de Paul. We also hold a July 1st Canada Day picnic on the church grounds.
