Do You Know?

St. Wencelas (Vaclav the Good)_
A change from the Apostles for our Christmas newsletter

There is the story of "Good King Wenceslas" from the traditional Christmas carol. It describes a scene from the life of Wenceslas that gives a glimpse into his heart. It tells of a cold, bitter night when Wenceslas and a page notice a poor man gathering wood. The kind hearted king asks where the man lives. He instructs the page that they will go that very night and provide the man with a meal.



Wenceslas is the Latinized version of the Old Czech name **Vaclav**. It means "more" or "greater") and "Slav" (meaning "glory" or "fame"), so it translates to "greater glory". Wenceslas was not actually a king, but a Duke. The Holy Roman Emperor, Otto I, bestowed the more prestigious title on him posthumously.

His father, **Vratislaus I**, was the Duke of Bohemia and a Christian. His mother, **Drahomíra**, though baptized before the marriage, was aligned with Bohemia's pagans. Václav (Wenceslas) was born c907. When he was about 13, his father died in battle and his paternal grandmother **Ludmila**, became regent. But the regency did not last long. In 921 resenting her mother-in-law's influence on the government and her

soon-to-be duke son, his mother had Ludmila killed. The authorities banished her for this in 922. Wenceslas became the duke of Bohemia when he was 18 and as a demonstration of his character and remembering the biblical command to "Honor your father and your mother" (Exodus 20:12), he brought his mother out of banishment and forgave her.

Wenceslas's kindness and generosity extended to the rich and poor alike. He was greatly dedicated to giving shelter to the homeless as well as to buying the freedom of slaves—especially the freedom of slave children. In an effort to spread Christianity further, Wenceslas invited missionaries to Bohemia.

But Bohemia came under threat from invasion by the Saxon and East Frankish ruler **Henry the Fowler**, and the Magyars from modern-day Hungary. When he submitted to Henry, Wenceslas provoked the ire of some of his nobles, who plotted against him with the help of his brother, **Boleslav (the Cruel).** On September 28, 929, Boleslav murdered Wenceslas, as he went to mass or at a feast where he was set upon by several assassins before his brother ran him through with a lance. He was only 25 years old

Like his grandmother, Wenceslas was hailed as a martyr and saint almost immediately.

His feast day is September 28.
